Museum Meiji-Mura

One of the world's largest open-air museums, Meiji-Mura is devoted to the Meiji period, which started over 110 years ago -- the time when the modernization of Japan began. The idea was to collect valuable buildings and other historical artifacts that would otherwise be destroyed, so that they can continue to be enjoyed by future generations. Reconstructed here, the buildings demonstrate the great advances and significance of the Meiji period. In Meiji-Mura, in addition to visiting historical buildings and viewing exhibits, by wearing period costumes and riding period transportation, you can almost travel back in time. Complete the sensory experience by sampling early-modern tool.


